## Standards for Awarding CPE Credits

A key benefit the North Texas ISACA Chapter delivers to IT, Audit, Risk, and Governance professionals is the opportunity to earn CPE (Continuing Professional Education) credits that are recognized and accepted by most State Boards of Accountancy and professional organizations. When you earn and report CPE for your CISA, CISM, CPA license, or other professional certification, the North Texas ISACA Chapter sponsorship numbers from the TSBPA (Texas State Board of Accountancy) and NASBA's National Registry of CPE Sponsors assure the issuer of your credential that the courses we provide are designed to help you increase professional competence and maintain an adequate level of current knowledge and proficiency.

The Chapter works hard to fulfill its responsibilities as a CPE sponsor for NASBA (National Association of State Boards of Accountancy) and TSBPA. Both organizations have stringent requirements for qualified speakers and quality program materials. There are also standards that specify how the programs and seminars are publicized and how CPE credits will be awarded. NASBA and TSBPA are very strict about issuing CPE credits and require sponsors to ensure that credits have truly been earned through the attendee's presence for the entire program. One CPE hour requires 50 minutes of attendance, the duration of most of our monthly luncheon, pre, and post programs. For one-CPE hour programs, NASBA and TSBPA do not allow awarding partial credit if the attendee is late or has to leave early. For programs of more than one-CPE hour, a half-hour of CPE credit can be awarded only if the attendee has earned a first full CPE credit hour.

As fellow professionals and ISACA volunteers, it's disappointing when we cannot issue you a CPE certificate because traffic, work, or other responsibilities cause you to miss a portion of the program meeting. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation; because the Chapter follows NASBA and TSBPA standards, maintaining our CPE sponsorship ensures that the CPE hours you report comply with your professional association's requirements. Throughout the year, the Chapter may put on up to 50 programs, so there are many opportunities for you to earn quality CPE at a very reasonable cost!

## News from ISACA International

### ***Mobile Devices May Pose Greatest Threat to Confidential Information - New ISACA White Paper***

ISACA has released a white paper detailing how the increasing popularity of mobile devices poses a significant threat of leaking confidential enterprise information and intellectual property.

In a new white paper titled "[Securing Mobile Devices](#)" ISACA noted that the use of wireless networks, typically less secure than wired networks, leaves information at greater risk for interception. From smartphones to USB sticks, many devices also store data that are unencrypted, which can result in sensitive information being compromised through interception and device theft or loss. Mobile devices can also be the targets of malware attacks as employees carry them beyond the protection of their company's network.

The white paper notes that a lack of enterprise control of physical devices, along with the growing practice of employees using personal devices for business, has increased mobile device risk levels.

### ***Certified in Risk and Information Systems Control (CRISC)***

CRISC™ (pronounced "see-risk") is the newest certification being offered by ISACA. The certification was designed for IT and business professionals who identify and manage risks through the development, implementation and maintenance of appropriate information systems controls.

Testing for CRISC certifications begins in the second half of 2011, but for professionals with at least eight years of relevant experience, a grandfathering program has been initiated that enables one to apply for the CRISC certification without taking the exam. The grandfathering option will remain open for one year, until April 2011. Additional information is available at [www.isaca.org/crisc](http://www.isaca.org/crisc).

As you review this section, you can ignore the "Chapter Compliance" portion that references an already-resolved issue. We're working with ISACA Int'l to get that outdated reference corrected.
