ISACA and The IIA Sign Memorandum of Understanding

In September, the senior management staff of ISACA and The IIA met to reflect on the challenges and opportunities we face in serving our similar constituencies. They laid the groundwork for a formal memorandum of understanding (MOU) between ISACA and The IIA, which has now been signed and is in effect.

The MOU creates a basis for cooperation and collaboration between ISACA and The IIA for the advancement of the global internal auditing profession through the mutual sharing of knowledge, experience and best practice, thus allowing the associations to benefit from each other's respective work and involvement. Taking Governance Forward Web Site Launch

ITGI and ISACA have led an initiative to provide an integrated, high-level overview of enterprise governance. Called Taking Governance Forward (TGF), the initiative examines the complex and layered world of governance, identifies and defines the components of a governance system, and conceptualizes how the many views of governance overlap and interact. The project was completed by a task force of ISACA members led by

Patrick Stachtchenko, CISA, CA.

ITGI and ISACA has delivered the results in an interactive web site, presenting the materials in a dynamic manner that allows everyone to contribute to the current market debate on what governance is and how it works. To facilitate and encourage this involvement, community interaction with the diagram, maps and term definitions is supported through discussion forums and wikis.

Certified in Risk and Information Systems Control (CRISC)

CRISC (pronounced see-risk) is the newest certification being offered by ISACA. The certification was designed for IT and business professionals who identify and manage risks through the development, implementation and maintenance of appropriate information systems controls.

Testing for CRISC certifications begins in the second half of 2011, but for professionals with at least eight years of relevant experience, a grandfathering program has been initiated that enables one to apply for the CRISC certification without taking the exam. The grandfathering option will remain open for one year, until April 2011. Additional information is available at www.isaca.org/crisc.

Free CPE Using Your ISACA Membership
